# How to Be Considered for a Grant Boeing's grantmaking is by invitation only. All organizations must be invited to submit a proposal.

- 1. Read the Boeing Florida grant objectives and local strategy f to determine if your request aligns with either of the following pillars:
  - Our Future: Tomorrow's Innovators
  - Our Heroes: Veterans & Families
- 2. Determine that your organization is eligible for support. Review the grants exclusion guidelines.
- 3. Contact your local community investor to discuss a proposed project.
- 4. If your community investor determines that your project aligns with Boeing's local strategies, you may be invited to submit either an LOI or a full grant application.
- 5. If you are invited to submit an LOI it will be evaluated for alignment, viability, measurable outcomes and broad impact. Should your LOI merit further interest, you will be invited to submit a full grant proposal.

**Goal:** Create cradle to career pathways to strengthen and diversify the pipeline of skilled workers entering today's dynamic labor market. Advance 21<sup>st</sup>-century skills such as knowledge acquisition, creativity, innovation, critical thinking, problem-solving, collaboration, media and technology literacy, self-direction, and adaptability skills.

#### **Concentration:**

- Early Learning: Increase the number of kindergartners who are ready for school, particularly in mathematics.
- Primary & Middle School: Generate interest and sustained participation in:
  - STEM disciplines through hands-on, experiential learning.
  - Arts Education/STEAM: Foster 21<sup>st</sup>-century skills by engaging young people in experiential learning in the arts and STEAM.
- High School: Graduate more students who are ready to enter STEM-related or other high demand careers and/or STEM-focused post-secondary education through high-quality career connected learning programs.
- Workforce Preparation: Prepare veterans, under-skilled adults and young adults for living-wage jobs in high-demand sectors.

#### **Concentration:**

- Workforce Transition: Invest in high-quality training and skill development programs for veterans and their families that help to prepare them for living-wage jobs in high-demand sectors.
- Recovery and Rehabilitation: Support hands-on recovery programs focusing on the following:
  - Post-traumatic stress
  - Moral and physical injuries
  - o Veteran suicide prevention
